

III. Textbooks, Readings and Other Materials

You are **required** to purchase access to the electronic homework submission website WileyPLUS. You may purchase access to the website only (“standalone code”), and this will give you access to an electronic version of the textbook. The ISBN for the standalone code for the website is **9780470075296**. You may purchase the standalone code for the website from the USCL bookstore.

In previous semesters, most students preferred to have a traditional copy of the textbook. If you purchase a new copy of the textbook from the USCL bookstore, you will receive access to WileyPLUS for free. The textbook for this course is Calculus, Anton/Bivens/Davis, 8th edition, ISBN **9780470103029**. It is also available at the USCL bookstore.

You are required to purchase access to WileyPLUS. I will provide information on how to register to use WileyPLUS in a separate handout and I will show you how to use it during the first week of class.

You are **required** to use a graphing calculator in this course. A TI-83 is highly recommended. You are not allowed to use a graphing calculator with alpha-numeric capabilities, such as a TI-89 or TI-92. You may not share calculators during quizzes or exams. You are required to bring a calculator to class every day.

We will be using a program called the Ubiquitous Presenter (UP) during class. This is a free tool, but you must register to use it. I will give you more information in a separate handout and I will show you how to use it during the first week of class.
